Building a City Where Every Child Can Play

Over the last 10 years the <u>Healthi Kids Coalition</u> has advocated for the POWER of PLAY for every child in every place. We know that play is critical to whole child health - kids that play every day are healthier, do better at school, and learn important social skills like team building and problem solving. We also know that PLAY is good for cities - playful cities foster economic development, drive innovation, promote safe and vibrant neighborhoods, and bring communities together.

The <u>PlayROCs campaign</u> has successfully galvanized change across the City of Rochester.

Partnered with residents, youth, and neighborhood champions, organizers have hosted pop up play days, met with elected officials, gone to City Council, and transformed neighborhoods for kids and play. They've created playful sidewalks, children's gardens, play streets, and Story Walks. They've raised their voices to demand change. Together they have and continue to advocate for safe and accessible play spaces for every child - because we all know it's a child's RIGHT to PLAY!
